Health care and Women's Ministry:

In many parts of rural Guatemala, women lack access to maternity care. Casa Materna, an international movement, helps provide more attention to pregnant women in isolated areas, in order to prevent deaths. Casa Materna Ana Sayre, working with CEDEPCA Women's Ministry, addresses this need in the small town of Cahabon. It provides a free and safe place to finish labor, located close to the town's health center.



Disaster Ministry

One of the greatest problems in Central America is the effect on communities when natural disasters and other crisis situations occur.



Natural disasters have long-term impacts on communities, reducing the ability of individuals and communities to control and improve their lives.

Disaster Ministry began in 2009, with a focus on training community leaders to prepare for, and recover from, natural disasters. The new ministry has been tested yearly by hurricanes, landslides, earthquakes and volcanic eruptions.
